Slide 14: Online Registration

- Some improvements we're looking to make this upcoming year:
 - Switching to Square as the payment processor = better in-person options, but higher fees
 - Utilizing membership/league specific onboarding
 - Switch back to one year memberships so we're onside with bylaws

Slide 15: Course Projects

- Norwester Park
 - Plan to install tee pads, tee signs, replace baskets, and plant trees.
 - Funding: Government of Alberta TBD, City of Edmonton \$19,000, EDGA \$15,000
 - Timeline: May - June 2026
- Science Park/Sunridge
 - The Government of Alberta has informed us that the majority of Strathcona Science Park has been deemed no longer suitable for development. 13 of the 18 holes of the original layout are in the no-development zone, so the course will not be moving forward as planned.
 - Next Steps: Joey is in contact with Sunridge to see if there is a way to fit a 9 hole course on their land, which is still suitable for development.
- Rundle Park
 - We've had initial discussions with the City of Edmonton about repairing the landscaping around the tee pads/baskets at Rundle. Need to submit a community construction plan with details and budget for the project. Goal is to improve course safety and prevent further erosion around tee pads
 - Funding: TBD, dependant on Norwester project funding and sponsorships

- Next Steps: Work with a landscaper to come up with a rough plan and budget to submit to CoE; Secure funding.
- Future Southside Course
 - We have identified several potential parks on the south side that would be viable for 9 or 18 hole courses and shared this list with CoE. There are also lands not owned by the City that may work. Goal is to have the support from one or more communities to build a course in 2027. Get approval from City stakeholders. Submit for grant funding.
 - Funding: Grants, Sponsorships.
 - Next Steps: We need to hold pop-up events and work with communities to get their support for building permanent courses in their neighbourhoods.

Slide 16: Hermitage Park 2026 Construction

- City of Edmonton and EPCOR have applied to the Alberta Utilities Commission to start construction on a new transmission line in 2026. The preferred route would see the additional power poles erected in the park in the field used by holes 7, 8, and 9. They expect to hear back about the project in January.
- We do not have any details about the construction timeline or potential course impacts, but are in contact with City of Edmonton and EPCOR about this project.
 - Are we going to get temporary baskets to make up for lost holes?

Slide 17: Hole Sponsorship

- City of Edmonton has approved a trial agreement that allows us to sell hole sponsorships on our courses
- Tee box signs & basket wraps
- All proceeds must go towards course development and improvements
- Sign ups start in January, sign installation in April
